In July, our riders rocked the South Dakota State Equestrian Competition as we returned to the Hippodrome to compete in the 2021 Equestrian Special Olympics. 27 athletes, 30 volunteers and 12 horses represented SPURS. Our riders brought home 23 Gold medals, 20 Silver, 19 Bronze, and a handful of 4th and 5th place ribbons. Everyone was happy to be back in Huron. We are incredibly proud of ALL our riders and their accomplishments.
